Introduction to Community Development **Block Grant** (CDBG)



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What is CDBG?

- Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) is federal funding managed by the Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD)
 - Entitlement vs. Non-entitlement
- State CDBG program administered by the Department of Housing and Community Development (HCD)
 - Approximately \$30 million annually
 - Supports non-entitlement cities and counties
- HCD'S CDBG Redesign
 - Stakeholder driven effort to revitalize the State CDBG program



- Eligible uses:
 - Economic Development
 - Business Assistance Loans & Infrastructure Grants
 - Housing Assistance
 - Homebuyer & Housing Rehab Assistance
 - Public Services
 - Nutrition, senior assistance, youth programs, etc.
 - Public Facilities
 - Community facilities, public safety, etc.
 - Public Infrastructure
 - Water, sewer, broadband, etc.
 - Planning
 - For activities that meet CDBG eligibility and priorities



CDBG Requirements

- National Objectives
 - Benefit to low- and moderate-income people
 - Individuals, households, & neighborhoods
 - Address slums and blight
 - Urgent need
- Federal Cross-Cutting Requirements
 - Davis-Bacon Labor Compliance
 - National Environmental Protection Act (NEPA)
 - Federal procurement standards
- Federally required program reporting and tracking
 - Demographic data, program/project performance tracking, beneficiary reporting



State and Federal Set-Asides and Limits

- Federal Limits
 - 15% limit on public services
 - 20% limit on planning & general administration
- State Set-Asides
 - 30% for economic development activities
 - 51% for housing related activities
 - 5% for activities in the Colonias
- All State CDBG funds must be obligated and spent within federal deadlines



2019-2020 CDBG NOFA

- 2 years of funding in one Notice of Funding Availability (NOFA) approx. \$60 million
 - NOFA in January 2020
 - Online Grant Management System
 - New CDBG Guidelines
 - Redesign Rollout
 - Over-the-counter (OTC) applications
 - New Program Income (PI) policies
 - New training modules on NEPA, procurement, and general program administration
