Los Angeles Promise Zone <u>Principle Statement</u>

To advance our vision, the Los Angeles Promise Zone Leadership Council prioritizes guiding Opportunity Zone investment to ensure that incoming capital functions to alleviate poverty, improve quality of life for low-income families in our communities, and promote equitable development without displacement. We prioritize investments within the Los Angeles Promise Zone that:



Create jobs for community members, with a living wage and opportunities for advancement. We encourage projects to connect community members to workforce development services, particularly those targeted to our most vulnerable community members.




Preserve and increase the amount of affordable housing. We encourage projects to connect low-income families in the LA Promise Zone to services to ensure they are aware of and equipped to apply for housing in these units.



Expand locally-owned small businesses. We know that local ownership of businesses creates jobs, cultivates a sense of place, and promotes investment in community institutions such as schools, parks and cultural centers.
