California is at the forefront of Zero Emission Vehicle (ZEV) production in the U.S. As the state strives to achieve its renewable energy objectives, it aims to boost the ZEV and battery manufacturing sectors, both part of the Clean Economy designation in the Jobs First Economic Blueprint. This sector is anticipated to expand by approximately 2.9% over the next eight years. The ZEV workforce encompasses various roles, including design, manufacturing, sales, installation, servicing, and maintenance of ZEVs and their infrastructure, like charging stations and distribution systems.


- \$44.21 million for workforce training through the <u>Clean</u> <u>Transportation Program</u>
