Regional Investment Initiative – Implementation Phase FAQ

Are the Round 2 dates before the Round 1 dates?

The Round 1 dates are in 2025. The Round 2 dates are in 2026.

Is there a total number of NOIs that can be submitted per region?

No.

Are individual municipalities eligible to submit a NOI?

Yes.

When and how will conveners receive the list of NOIs that the state receives?
Will the list be public or just shared with regional conveners?

The list of eligible NOIs will be posted on the GO-Biz website within 48 hours of the due date.

 Will the lead entity serve as the fiscal agent for all awarded projects within a regional cluster, or will each project be awarded through individual contracts?

Each project will be awarded independently through specific fiscal agents.

Are private for-profit entities eligible to be members of the coalition?

Yes, but they may not lead any projects as they are not eligible applicants.

 Will the Steering Committee have the authority to vote on the list of projects that will receive a letter from the associated regional Convenor.

No. Please review page 6 of the Implementation Phase RFP.

Will any educational webinars and TA assistance be provided?

Yes. A pre-recorded informational presentation will be posted to the GO-Biz website on Monday, March 24, 2025.

Will all eligible project cluster receive funding?

No.

 Can a lead entity on one project also be a partner on another project they are not leading?

Yes.

 Is the state going to evaluate projects mostly based on the project itself, or how it fits in with the other projects in the cluster? Or both?

Is each project cluster required to have 3-8 ready to go projects?

Yes.

 How will project clusters that are not under "Accelerate" or "Bet" be considered?

Please see page 5 of the Implementation Phase RFP.

• Will project clusters under "Strengthen" or "Anchor" be considered for funding?

No.

What is the ceiling for overhead/administrative costs?

Administrative costs are limited to 10% of the total award.

• What constitutes a "Regional Coalition?"

Please review page 5 of the Implementation Phase RFP.

• Can the grants be used to secure land to build workforce housing - are these grants usable for land acquisition?

Yes, but all projects should be ready-to-go upon award.

Is there a required structure for the regional coalitions?

No.

 If a coalition is approved for funding, will individual awards be issued to each of the individual project leads since they are being evaluated independently?

Coalitions will be deemed eligible in the pre-application phase, but not all projects within the cluster are guaranteed funding.

 Are projects involving an employer sponsored housing model that aim to lower the barrier to housing for teachers and other school district employees eligible for Implementation grant funding?

Yes, if they are tied to a project cluster that is aimed at advancing job creation, attraction, and access in a tradable sector within the "Accelerate" or "Bet" buckets, as defined in the State Economic Blueprint.

Can a proposal address multiple economic sectors?

No.

 If we have several questions that have not been addressed, can we speak with someone at GO-Biz over the phone to get our questions answered?

During the open application period, GO-Biz staff are not able to speak with potential applicants. A second FAQ will be produced ahead of the Pre-Application application deadline.

• Can an individual implementation project support cross-regions as well?

Yes, but a letter confirming regional plan alignment will be required with the pre-application submission from each related regional convenor.

We understand for-profit entities are not eligible to apply as the lead applicant.
Are for-profits eligible to receive funds either as a subaward or a service contractor?

Yes.

 For question one on the pre-application, we must provide an overview of each project and there are expected to be between 3 to 8 projects per project cluster.
Is the cap 300 words per project times the number of projects proposed? Or 300 words total regardless of number of projects?

300 words regardless of the number of projects.

 Can you share more content details for the full application proposal stage of the RII Implementation Phase?

Additional details will be available for lead entities and project leads for approved preapplications.

 Does the lead applicant need to be affiliated with regional conveners or another pre-designated entity in an economic region, or can an independent nonprofit coalition apply directly?

An independent non-profit may apply, however as the application proceeds through the process, a letter confirming the project aligns with the regional strategy will be required from the regional convenor.

 If regional coalition participation is required, can an independent nonprofit form its own coalition outside of the regional convener? Yes.

 Are there any restrictions on new applicants that were not previously engaged in prior phases?

No.

 At what point will the lead entity need to submit the letter from the regional convenor? Is a letter required per project or for the full cluster?

No. Letters are due with pre-applications. Only one letter is required per project cluster.

• Can our region submit our own Ag-tech cluster of projects if another region is also submitting an interregional Ag-tech project cluster that includes other agtech projects within our region?

Yes.

 Can we develop a cluster of projects under the "Accelerate" sector of Advanced/Precision Manufacturing? (Advanced Manufacturing is listed as an Accelerate sector, but on the graphic in the Economic Blueprint, the font and placement is different than other sectors.)

Yes.

 The RFP states that an organization can only be a lead entity for one project cluster. But can an organization be the project lead on more than one project?

Yes.

 Since submitting our Regional Plan, our regional stakeholders have identified Biotech as a sector that they want to pursue. Can we submit a Biotech cluster even though it wasn't featured prominently in our Regional Plan?

Yes, as long as the sector is identified in some way in the regional plan(s).

 Will each project have its own fiscal agent or does one entity have to serve as the fiscal agent for the entire cluster?

Each project will be awarded to distinct fiscal agents.

 I would like to clarify whether or not the "partnerships" referred to in the materials refer only to organizations that are financial partners. Regional coalitions can and should include a variety of partners, including individual project proponents and additional nonprofit and for-profit partners.

Can there be subcontractors/vendors that are for profit?

Yes.

• Can any one entity be part of multiple applications? For example, can an entity submit an LOI as a lead entity AND be included in another lead entity's project coalition?

Yes.

 Can a lead entity ALSO contribute a unique project to the sector cluster within the application?

Yes.

Can a project be represented in multiple applications throughout the state?

Yes, as long as it is tied back to the tradable sector identified in the NOI.
